### Program Outline

The program will consist of two phases. Phase I will involve the participants in on-line assignments that include directed readings and response exercises. Participants will receive assignments during the months of July and August. These assignments are brief in consideration of your time demands. The assignments include reviews of critical leadership concepts and issues plus related activities. The purpose of the assignments is to allow the participants to increase and broaden their knowledge and understanding of the critical leadership issues presidents face and to become skilled in determining the underlying leadership concepts, opportunities and problems. In so doing, the participants will develop a greater appreciation for the role presidential leadership plays in the success of a college. Phase II of the program consist of a concluding Seminar that will build on the common base of knowledge developed during Phase I. The Seminar will be oriented towards the practical side of presidential leadership. The faculty will be individuals who have outstanding reputations as experienced leaders in community colleges or in equivalent leadership positions.
